This year's competition takes place Saturday, November 3, 2012 at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto, Ontario. Participants in two age categories from 11-24 years old are invited to prepare and present five to seven minute speeches in English or French.


In addition to the experience and opportunity to share ideas in a public forum, finalists in both the junior and senior division will receive cash prizes. Assistance with accommodation will also be provided.
